Why do we need a European foreign policy?

The EU is a major global actor, because of its broad competences in the area of trade and the size of the EU economy, however, the EU also plays an important role in international development and humanitarian aid, conflict prevention and the promotion of human rights. In its external relations policies, the EU puts a special focus on relations with neighbouring countries. We, young people, are convinced about the need to have a holistic approach to a common foreign policy as we are committed too in the processes we are involved¹. On a lot of areas we can get better results when we cooperate with each other and take a common, firm and clearly position to the outside world. If we optimise the foreign policy the EU will get a better image in the outside world. In this way we can promote our combined values and interests. Besides that the European cooperation will be an example for the rest of the world.

What are our goals?

With this document we want to give a handout to youth organizations on national level to trigger the discussions about a European foreign policy. This bottom up approach is important because youth will start to think about how Europe should look like and hopefully get more involved in the European processes. Besides that it is the only way we get to know what the youth opinion is about the way EU foreign policy should develop. Should we promote European values, human rights, democracy and rule of law? We want to hear from them how the idealistic European foreign policy should look like in the future. For this we want to focus on a few main topics on which the European Union should better cooperate.

How do we want to reach these goals and which values do we base based on which values? The base of our policy on foreign affairs should have their base in European values of democracy, equality, solidarity and respect for human rights.

We also suggest that an EU constitution would give a greater credibility and coherence to the external relations of the EU. One single policy for the entire EU, so that we can speak with one vice. The mosaic of particular strengths and competences of the EU Member States should be made use of.

We feel that some important issues are generally regarded as.. soft and need to be included in the external policies for the added value and new approach.
